


2025 RULES & PROCEDURES HANDBOOK

This handbook of rules and procedures is designed to help racers and their crew and families get the most enjoyment and value from a race day with the NHKA.



GENERAL REGULATIONS

All drivers, crew and family members are required to sign an appropriate Waiver and Release of Liability.

All attendees under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. A minor release package for the current year must be signed by parent or legal guardian. No exceptions.

At ALL times while on the property, all drivers and guests must wear a pit pass wristband that's number matches the number on the waivers signed. DO NOT REMOVE wristband if returning a second day. Wristbands that have been removed are no longer valid and a replacement must be purchased.

All drivers must sign a Driver Release Form. Any driver who enters the race course without signing the Driver Release Form will be immediately removed from the event. NO exceptions.

All drivers must be entered in a class and have proof of registration attached to their kart before going on track.

All drivers, including minor drivers, are responsible for the actions of their crew, family and guests.

Spectators are allowed in the pit area and designated track viewing areas. Spectators are not allowed in the grid area and forbidden from entering the race course without the explicit permission of the race director given at that time.

All NHKA officials, drivers, crew, families, etc. are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful manner. Detrimental behavior will be subject to permanent suspension and loss of all points and results.

PIT AREA RULES

Race engines may not be started before 8:05am.

Race karts may never be driven in the pit area.

Attendees are expected to clean up their pit area. TAKE HOME ALL USED TIRES and FUEL CANS. Do not leave them ANYWHERE on the track property.

NHKA and racing facilities are not responsible for lost or stolen property.

All dogs and pets must be leashed at all times while the race course is live.

No open alcoholic containers or drinking by anyone allowed anywhere on track property until the race course is closed for the day. Anyone drinking during the race day will be removed from the property along with the associated driver.

No non-registered motor vehicles, bicycles, skateboards, skates, inline skates, skate shoes, scooters, etc. allowed on track property at any time.

SAFETY

Safety is the primary concern at all events. Kart racing has inherent risks of injury, even death. Each competitor assumes those risk when they participate. While measures are taken to reduce those risks, they cannot be eliminated. Please read the Waiver and Release of Liability available at registration.

All drivers must wear all the required safety gear to enter the race course. Responsibility for the quality, condition and correct use of the equipment falls upon the competitor, or parent/legal guardian of a competitor who is a minor. Any driver who loses any gear on track will be black flagged.

Helmets Must be full-faced and designed for kart, motorcycle or open-wheel car racing. All helmets must be inspected and tagged during pre-race safety inspection, and must be Snell 2015 or higher or SFI approved. Note: DOT is not a racing designation.

Video Cameras May not be mounted to the inside or outside of the helmet or driver's body. Cameras may only be mounted with a tether to the kart.

Driving Suit Must be of abrasion-resistant material specifically designed for kart or motorcycle racing. Leathers are OK. Must be of appropriate size. No exposed ankles, wrists, neck or other skin. Note: Nomex fire-resistant auto racing suits are not abrasion resistant.

Gloves Must be manufactured for racing and worn at all times on track.

Shoes Racing shoes highly recommended. Work boots or high-top sneakers are allowed upon inspection.

Neck Protection A neck collar, neck roll or neck device must be used. Must be in original manufactured condition. No modifications.

Rib & Chest Protectors Rib protectors are recommended for all drivers. Chest protectors are required for drivers under 12 years of age.

Pre-Race Safety Inspection All karts must pass a pre-race safety inspection at every event before going on track. Note: Safety inspection does not verify the legality of kart for a particular class.

RACE REGISTRATION

NHKA Membership required to race. As space allows, race registration will open to non-members after the members entry deadline.

All participants must register online, or mail a paper entry form, by the posted deadline (typically the Tuesday before the race.) Race entries will be capped as listed on the online registration website.

Drivers new to the NHKA must submit a racing history to the race director prior to race day. New drivers without appropriate experience will be required to attend a driving safety and procedures course before attending an event.

If an entry has been paid and the event is held, there will be no refunds paid to a driver who did not attend that event. Special circumstances may be discussed.

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

All scheduled events will be held rain or shine. Rain events may be cancelled due to abnormally unsafe conditions.

All drivers must attend the drivers meeting. Minor drivers must bring a parent or adult. Drivers who do not attend will not race that day.

Grid area must remain clear of people, equipment and stands. Only one driver and one crew member with a grid pass allowed. No open-toed shoes allowed.

RACE DAY FORMAT

A race day consists of two group practice sessions, one timed qualifying session, one final race for championship points.

Practice groups of similar age and speed classes will be posted near the grid.

Race groups and schedule will be posted near the grid. Note: Race groups may be different than practice groups starting with qualifying. Always check.

ON-TRACK PROCEDURES

All drivers are required to be in position on the grid prior to going on track. Karts entering course out of position will start the race at the end of the field.

Any stopping on track during the warm-up lap will result in starting at rear of the field. This includes spins and collisions.

Drivers exiting the course and entering the pit area will not be allowed to reenter the course. Exception: If a race official instructs a driver to exit the course for any reason the official may allow reentry.

Breakdowns The driver is responsible for getting the kart and themselves to a safe area and seeking instructions from the nearest corner worker. If the driver leaves the seat of the kart they are finished for that session.

Accidents Drivers are responsible for removing damaged karts from racing surface and following the instructions of the nearest corner worker. If karts are tangled together and the drivers need to exit their seats to untangle them they are allowed to reenter the race provided the karts are on the racing surface.

Unsafe or over-aggressive driving will be grounds for disqualification. Penalties will be determined by the race director.

Restarts When a full-course yellow or red flag occurs on the first lap, the entire field will restart as qualified, less karts unable to continue. Restarts after at least one lap has been completed by the entire field will be single file with the order determined by the last completed scored lap. In either case, karts judged by officials to have caused the incident will restart at the back of the field.

FLAG RULES

Green Flag The starter waiving the green flag starts or restarts the race. The driver on pole position sets the pace lap speed. All karts must be in a tight formation. No gaps. The race starts at the wave of the green flag.

Waiving Yellow Flag May be local or full course. Drivers must slow down to a safe and controlled speed. No passing. Racing resumes after the incident has been passed and the next flag station does not display a waving yellow flag.

Stationary Yellow Flag Warning of an abnormal situation on the race course such as debris or a slow kart. Racing continues with passing allowed.

Red Flag Stops the race. Drivers must come to a complete stop in a safe manner at the edge of the racing surface and wait for instructions. DO NOT CONTINUE INTO THE PIT AREA. No work or adjustments may be performed on any kart in that race during the red flag period. Any unauthorized work is grounds for disqualification.

Waved Black Flag This indicates a problem with the vehicle or over-aggressive driving. Drivers must continue the lap and exit the track into the pits in a normal manner. DO NOT STOP ON THE TRACK. Driver must then wait for instructions from a race official.

Rolled Black Flag Warns a driver that their actions will result in a waved black flag if they continue. It does not require the driver to exit the track. A driver may get a waved black flag without this warning.

Crossed White and Checkered Flags Indicates that half of the scheduled race laps/distance/time are complete.

Blue Flag A warning to a slower driver that they are about to be lapped by one or more faster karts. The slower driver must allow the faster driver(s) to pass, signaling which side the faster driver is to pass. IT IS THE FASTER DRIVER'S RESONSIBILY TO PASS IN A SAFE MANNER. Drivers racing for position are to pass single file and not use the slower driver for a pick. If two or more slower drivers are racing for position a blue flag will not be displayed.

White Flag Displayed at finish line to indicate the beginning of the final lap.

Checkered Flag The race or session is over. Proceed to the pit area.

Checkered and Black Flags The race is over, but the results are under review by NHKA officials.

Flagging violations are at the discretion of the corner marshals. If a flagging violation is protested, NHKA officials and the corner marshals will discuss the violation. Final decision of violation will be decided by the corner marshals. Penalties will be decided by NHKA officials.

POST-RACE/POST-QUALIFYING PROCEDURES

All drivers and karts must proceed directly to the scales after qualifying and the race. Failure to weigh will result in disqualification. If a kart/driver are not physically able to weigh, the race director must be notified before either leave the scale area.

No crew members or beverages allowed in the scale line.

Failing to meet the minimum weight for the registered class after qualifying will result in a starting penalty for the race. Failure to meet minimum weight after the final race will result in disqualification and a -2 championship points penalty for that race.

If a driver/kart is light on the scales the driver may request one reweigh which will be performed immediately. The driver and one crew member may validate that the scales read zero before rolling back on. If still light, the driver may wait with their kart in the impound area. After the rest of the field crosses the scales, the race director will review the situation and may reweigh the driver/kart again. If still deemed light, the driver will be disqualified.

All karts are subject to a post-race technical inspection to confirm compliance with the rules and specifications of the chassis and engine governing the class.

Technical disqualification will result in a -2 points penalty. Depending upon the infraction the race director may assess further penalties.

PROTESTS

Protests for finishing positions must be presented in writing within 30 minutes of the results being posted.

Appeal for a disqualification must be presented in writing by the disqualified driver within 30 minutes of the disqualification.

The use of onboard or trackside video is NOT allowed in the appeals process. Note: NHKA officials may request to review onboard or trackside video in pursuit of improved safety.

Only karts and engines conforming to one of the above classes will be allowed unless approved by Race Director BEFORE race day.

Race Director may make exceptions and amendments to rules at anytime in the best interest of the club, safety and competition.

CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS STRUCTURE

1st Place: 100 points
2nd Place: 90 points
3rd Place: 85 points
4th Place: 80 points
5th Place: 75 points
6th Place: 70 points
7th Place: 65 points
8th Place: 60 points
9th Place: 55 points
10th Place: 50 points
11th Place: 45 points
12th-Last Place: 40 points

Points are awarded for the final race only. Only NHKA Racing Series members receive championship points.

One Drop Race The lowest scoring race of the season will be dropped from the final calculation of each driver's final championship points total. This may be a race not attend, but will not be a race missed due to suspension. If a race is cancelled, that race will be everyone's drop.

Disqualification -2 points will be given for a disqualification and will NOT be the drop race in final championship points calculations.

Did Not Start (DNS) If for whatever reason a driver is unable to start the final race, so long as the entry fee has been paid and the kart is presented to the grid by the driver (or they have spoken directly to the race director in advance) the driver will receive points for the position after the last kart scored on the track. If more than one driver is to receive DNS points, they will be sorted by qualifying result, then by least annoying. Special circumstances may apply at the discretion of the race director. No-show to the grid or event will result in 0 points.

Tie Breaker In the event of two drivers having equal final season championship points (after calculating the drop), the tied position will be awarded to the highest finishing driver in the last race of the season.

A driver must participate in at least six races to be eligible for year-end awards in a particular class.



GENERAL KART REQUIREMENTS

A fully functional transponder is required for all on-track sessions. Must be mounted to the seat back or side rear of the seat mount. May not be carried on the driver's person (i.e., in a pocket.) Drivers without transponders (or with malfunctioning transponders) will be scored in last place. Note: Transponders are available to rent with race registration.

All drivers must have their designated number on all four sides of their kart. Kart numbers are assigned through the membership application process.

Lead weights must be painted white and have the kart number. Must be securely mounted with bolt at least 5/16" or 8mm, and must be double nutted. One bolt per 1-5lbs, two bolts for 5-10lbs. Individual weights more than 10lbs must have their mounting approved by the race director. No stacking weights. All bolts must pass through a purpose-drilled hole (e.g., DO NOT mount dive weights through the belt slots, etc.) Lead sheets in the seat must be bolted to the seat as prescribed. Weights and mounting will be checked in pre-race safety inspection.

Video cameras must be mounted and tethered to the kart for pre-race safety inspection. Cameras mounted to the inside or outside of helmet NOT allowed.

CLASS TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

General chassis specifications, engine regulations, brake requirements, heights, widths, bodywork, etc. can be found on the TaG USA website www.tagracing.net and will be used unless otherwise specified.

Only karts and engines conforming to a NHKA championship class will be allowed. Any chassis not approved by the rule set governing its class (i.e., not homologated or the product of a major kart manufacturer) must be inspected and approved by the race director prior to going on track.

Violations of NHKA class technical specifications or their intent will result in loss of finishing positions, points and/or disqualification as well as suspension for the remainder of the event or season.

Any non-conforming parts may be confiscated by NHKA officials and penalties assessed such as loss of finishing positions, points and/or disqualification as well as suspension for the remainder of the event or season.

Any sealed engines found to be non-conforming must be corrected, reinspected and resealed by a shop authorized to do so before that engine is allowed back on track.

The race director may make exceptions and amendments to the rules in the best interest of the club, safety and competition.

<u>FUEL</u> Racing fuel or pump gas of any octane. Must follow manufacturer specified oils and quantities.

TIRES Open, 4.50 front and rear

<u>CLASS PROCEEDURES</u> No official scoring or championship. No qualifying, finals or rain racing. On track 3-4 times in morning with the last session during lunch. No entry fee, but pit passes must be purchased for driver and guests.

Approved TaG Engines

These approved TaG engines only. Any non-listed engines must be approved in advance by the race director. Must conform to the latest rules according to TaG USA or manufacturer, as indicated. See individual class rules below for details.

- IAME X30: One-piece exhaust only. Adjustable flex not allowed. Selettra Digital K ignition only. Engine specs according to TaG USA Rules.
- ROTAX 125MAX EVO: Must be all EVO, pre-EVO parts not allowed. Engine specs and seals per US Rotax MaxChallenge Rules.
- ROK G.P.: Engine specs according to ROK Cup Rules.

REAR WHEELS 210mm or 221mm only.

- IAME X30: 405lbs minimum weight, TaG USA Rules
- ROTAX 125MAX EVO: 400lbs min weight, US Rotax MaxChallenge Rules
- Parilla Leopard: 405lbs min weight, TaG USA Rules
- ROK G.P.: 420lbs min weight, ROK Cup Rules

Briggs 206 Classes

Briggs and Stratton 206 Racing Engine only. All engines must have the factory seal or seals. Engine specs according to the current Briggs 206 United States Rule Set. Exception: All Briggs 206 classes for NHKA must use the Briggs World Formula part #557164 Header and RLV part #4110 silencer. Silencer insert NOT allowed. Hilliard Flame clutch only in all Briggs 206 classes. Stock unmodified Flame parts only. All four shoes must be present and operational. Dust shield behind hub must be used. Stock Hilliard springs only and may be used in pairs of equal tension. For example: 4 black springs or 2 black and 2 white springs. Stacking springs not allowed. Weights are allowed. Drum and shoes must be stock and unmodified and free from grease or chain lube. See individual class listings below for additional information.

CLUTCH Hilliard Flame only.

FUEL VP MS93, VP MS98 or pump gas of any octane. No mixing.

OIL Briggs 4T 4-Cycle Oil only. No additives.

TIRES Open, 4.60 front and rear

AGE 8-12 years old

MIN WEIGHT 250lbs

CHASSIS Intermediate-size, no front brakes, TaG USA Rules

ENGINE Briggs 206, red carb slide, Briggs 206 Engine Class Regulations

HEADER WRAP/GUARD Required and subject to post-race tech inspection.

EXHAUST Briggs part #557164 header and RLV part #4110 silencer must be used. Silencer insert not allowed.

GEARING #35 chain 17-62 gearing only. #219 chain 20-73 gearing only. No other gear combination allowed.

CLUTCH Hilliard Flame only.

<u>FUEL</u> Designated pump gas, VP MS93 or VP MS98. No mixing.

OIL Briggs 4T 4-Cycle Oil only. No additives.

TIRES LeCont Red, 4.60 front and fear

<u>WHEELS</u> All wheels must be 5" diameter, width must be 5-5.25" (130mm - 135mm)

CHASSIS Full-size, no front brakes, TaG USA Rules

TIRES LeCont Red, 4.60 front, 6.00 rear

REAR WHEEL WIDTH 6.75-7.25" or 180mm

World Formula Classes

Briggs and Stratton World Formula engine only. Engine rules per the NHKA World Formula Box Stock Engine Program. Unmodified stock Hilliard Flame clutch and parts only. All four shoes must be present and operational. Dust shield behind hub must be used. Stock Hilliard springs only and may be used in pairs of equal tension. For example: 4 black springs or 2 black and 2 white springs. Stacking springs not allowed. Weights are NOT allowed. Drum and shoes must be stock and unmodified and free from grease or chain lube.

World Formula Light

MIN WEIGHT 360lbs

CHASSIS Full-size, no front brakes, TaG USA Rules

ENGINE Briggs World Formula, NHKA World Formula Box Stock Engine Program
